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Co-Design in ECO²SCAPE

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Definition and goals of Co-Design

Co-Design is generally understood as the intensive collaboration of different stakeholders in the development of solutions for practical problems.

The aim of the co-design process in ECO²SCAPE is to develop recommendations for measures to protect biodiversity and ecosystem services jointly with farmers and other stakeholders in the model region. In this context, the feasibility and experiences of farmers, the costs and financing possibilities and the integration into existing policy instruments or structures play an important role.

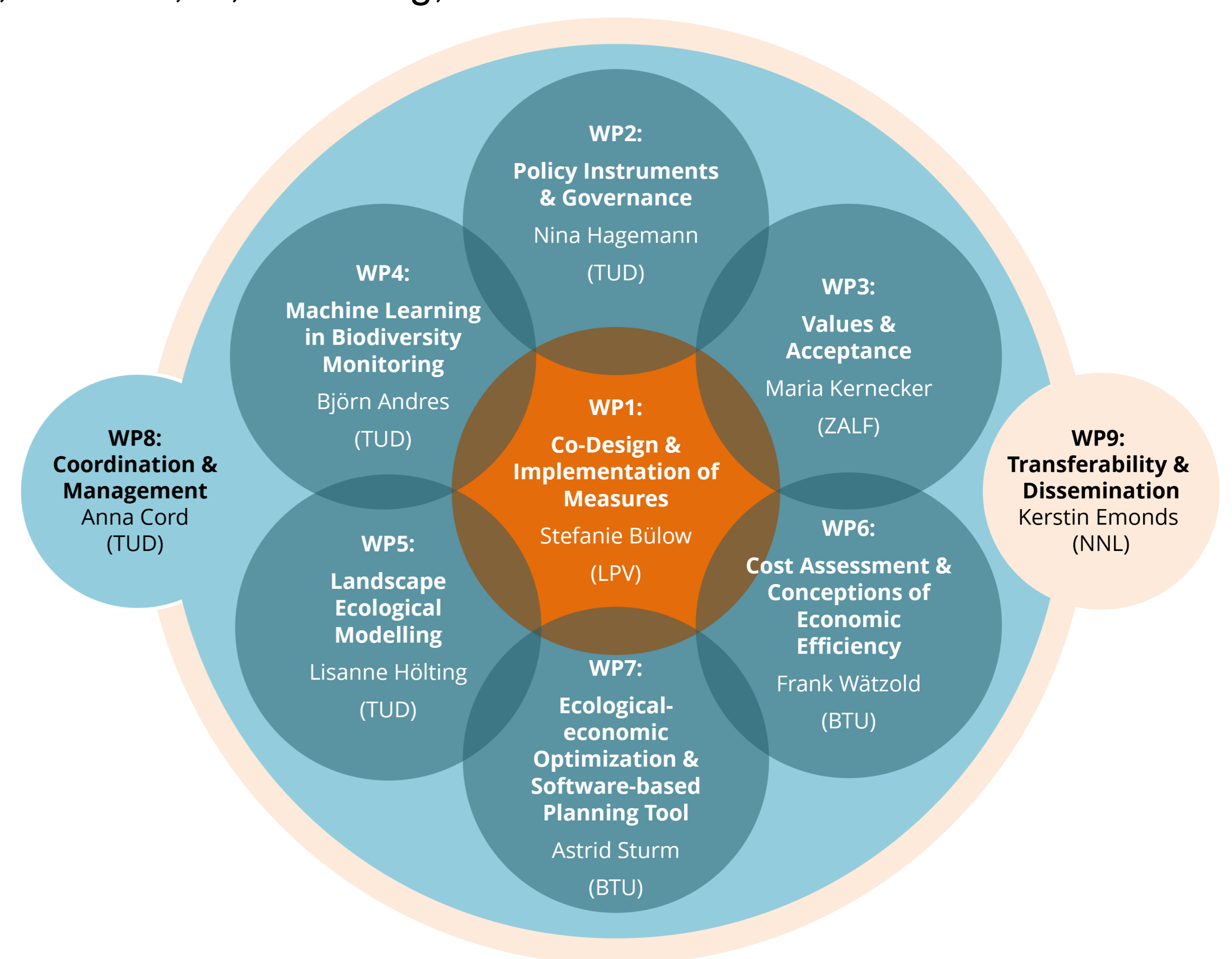


Fig. 1: Co-Design and implementation of measures is a key element of the project structure

Steps in the Co-Design process in ECO²SCAPE:

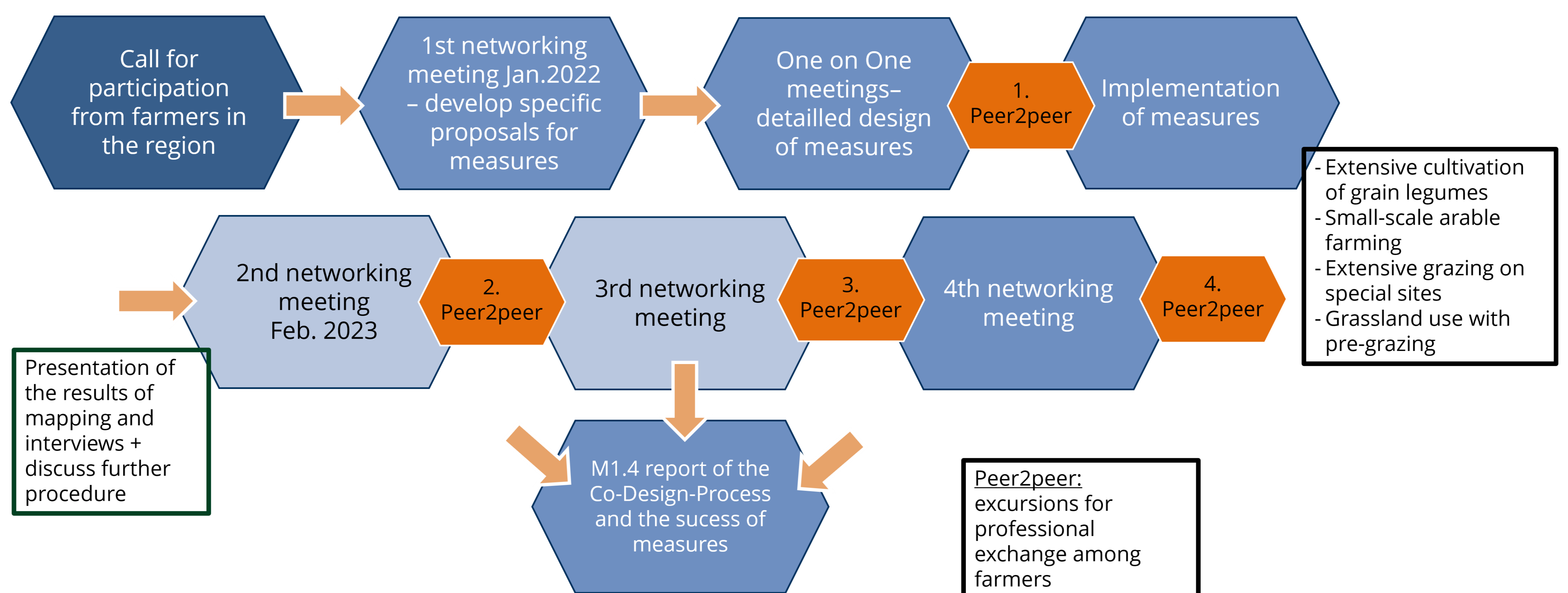


Fig.2: Steps in the Co-Design process of the development and implementation of measures for biodiversity conservation in ECO²SCAPE
